- WHEREAS strong Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) educational programs are vital to the intellectual and economic future of the state of Texas and, further, the United States of America; and
- WHEREAS Texas STEM academies, schools, and businesses have made strong efforts, working to close the disparity between the number of STEM field college graduates and the number of skilled workers needed in STEM industries; and
- WHEREAS it is anticipated that the United States will have more than 1.2 million job openings in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM)-related occupations by 2018, including positions for scientists, doctors, software developers, and engineers, who will be needed to lead our nation in addressing tough global challenges; and
- WHEREAS the Honorable Rick Perry, Governor of Texas, issued a statewide proclamation recognizing April 28 – May 4, 2014 as "Celebration of STEM Education Week in Texas," thereby demonstrating his support of strong STEM education in Texas schools and highlighting the work currently being done by STEM academies, schools, and businesses; and
- WHEREAS "Celebration of STEM Education Week in Texas" is the first such statewide collaborative project of its kind, aiming to involve as many STEM-centered organizations, businesses, and educational institutions as possible in municipalities across our great state;
