As we prepare for the TMCA Annual Awards Banquet, this is the perfect time to think of honoring a mentor who has made an impact on your career and our profession. Please consider nominating an individual for one of the following honors:

The **Distinguished Service Award** is awarded in recognition of an individual who has distinguished themselves by making a significant contribution throughout their career to promote the municipal clerk profession, TMCA, Inc., and their peers. Nominees must be a TRMC, have been a member of TMCA for at least ten years (members are eligible up to two years after retirement), and must have demonstrated a significant contribution to the city secretary profession, their community, or to TMCA. **Nominate now.**

Lifetime TMCA Membership is awarded in recognition of a member's significant contributions to the city secretary profession and in advancing the goals of TMCA, Inc., and TMCCP. Individuals become eligible for nomination after retirement and 10 years of active membership in good standing with the Association. Awardees are not subject to annual membership dues. **Nominate now.**

Honorary TMCA Membership is awarded in recognition of an individual who has performed exceptional services for the Association and for the improvement of municipal clerks and/or city secretaries. Awardees are not subject to annual membership dues. **Nominate now.**

These honors will be announced at the TMCA Annual Awards Banquet, held in conjunction with the Graduate Institute, in Corpus Christi in October. The names of the winners of these

awards will be kept secret until announced at the banquet.

Nominations for these honors can be submitted by anyone (i.e. Chapter, Mayor, Councilmember, supervisor, friend, or citizen). The nomination form can be downloaded here and must be submitted to municlerks@unt.edu by **Wednesday, July 15, 2020.**

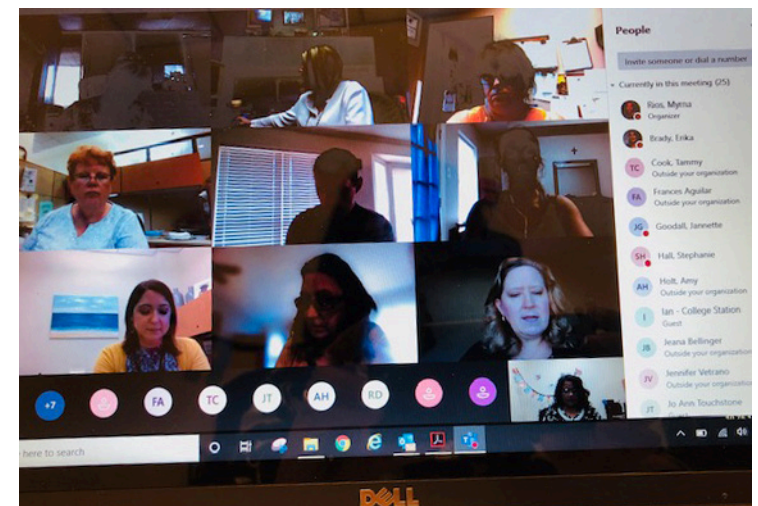
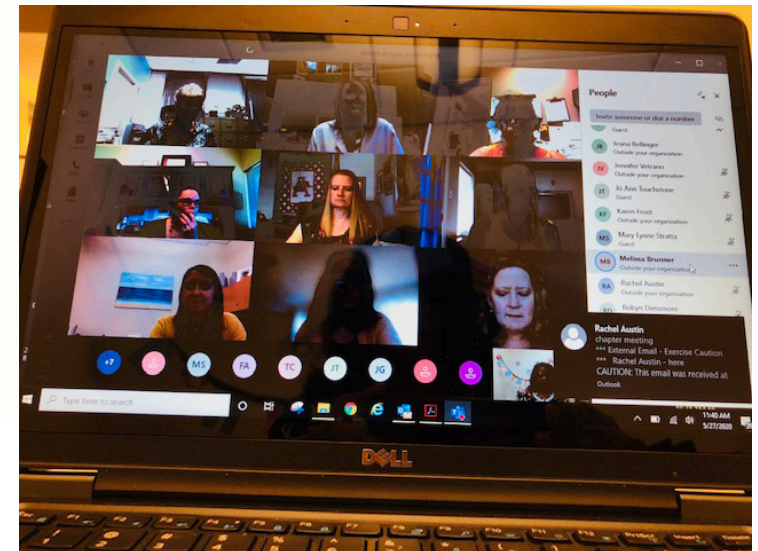

City Secretary Receives Achievement of Excellence Award

The Manor City Council held a Special Called Session on April 23 via a virtual zoom session. There was a quorum present and Mayor Larry Wallace Jr. called the meeting to order. After the pledge, it was announced there were no public comments. The Council approved the sole item under the Consent Agenda, which was approval of the April 15, 2020 Regular Meeting minutes.

Under the Regular Agenda, the first item approved was a Resolution asking that Onco Electric Delivery Company LLC's application for approval of a distribution cost recovery factor pursuant to Texas Administrative Code 23.243 to increase distribution rates with the city be denied.

Next, the Council approved a license agreement with the Hamilton Point Homeowners Association, Inc., for the installation and maintenance of four (4) message posts along the right of way in the Hamilton Point Subdivision. City Manager Tom Bolt stated that the HOA is assuming all of the responsibility.

The next item involved a possible development agreement for the Grandale at Manor Apartments and the City of Manor. Bolt stated that the development agreement for the new complex does allow for some increased masonry, some landscaping and fencing which they would not be able to get without the development agreement. After some discussion, the Council gave the approval.

Lastly, the Council approved an Ordinance Continuing a State of Local Disaster Declaration for the City of Manor. The Mayor added that the City of Manor is deeming it necessary at this time to continue the original declaration, now set to expire June 1, 2020. This declaration does not amend Travis County Order 2020-07, the shelter-in-place and face masks required order, beyond May 8th.

Before adjourning, Mayor Wallace announced an accomplishment by our City Secretary Livia Almanza. He read a letter he received stating that out of 597 member cities, the "Office of the Municipal Clerk in the City of Manor is one of 18 to receive the inaugural Texas Municipal Clerk's Achievement of Excellence award." This program is one that "recognizes the statutory requirements and demand for effective management of resources, proper governance by the Municipal Clerk's Office". The award "recognizes municipal clerk offices throughout the state for compliance with federal, state and local statutes that govern standards necessary to fulfill the duties and responsibilities" of that office. In order to receive this award, the municipal clerk must have met 9 out of 12 standards.

Those receiving this award will be announced in the July newsletter from the organization and recipients will officially be recognized with the award in Corpus Christi in October of this year at the Graduate Institute. Mayor Wallace congratulated Livia and expressed his appreciation for a job that is much more than a secretary, stating that she performs a lot of "key work that is vital to the City of Manor and to the community". He commended her for doing an "outstanding job". With no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

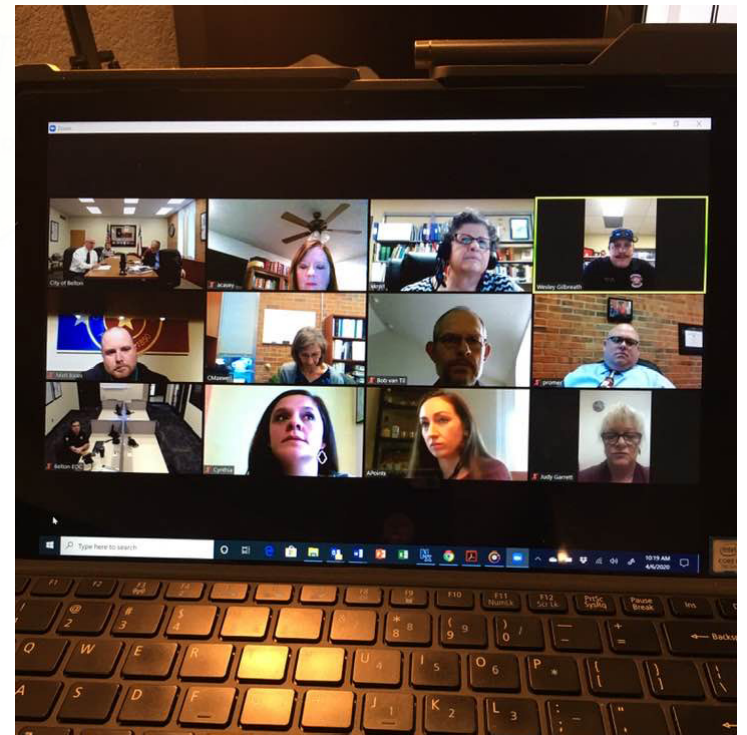

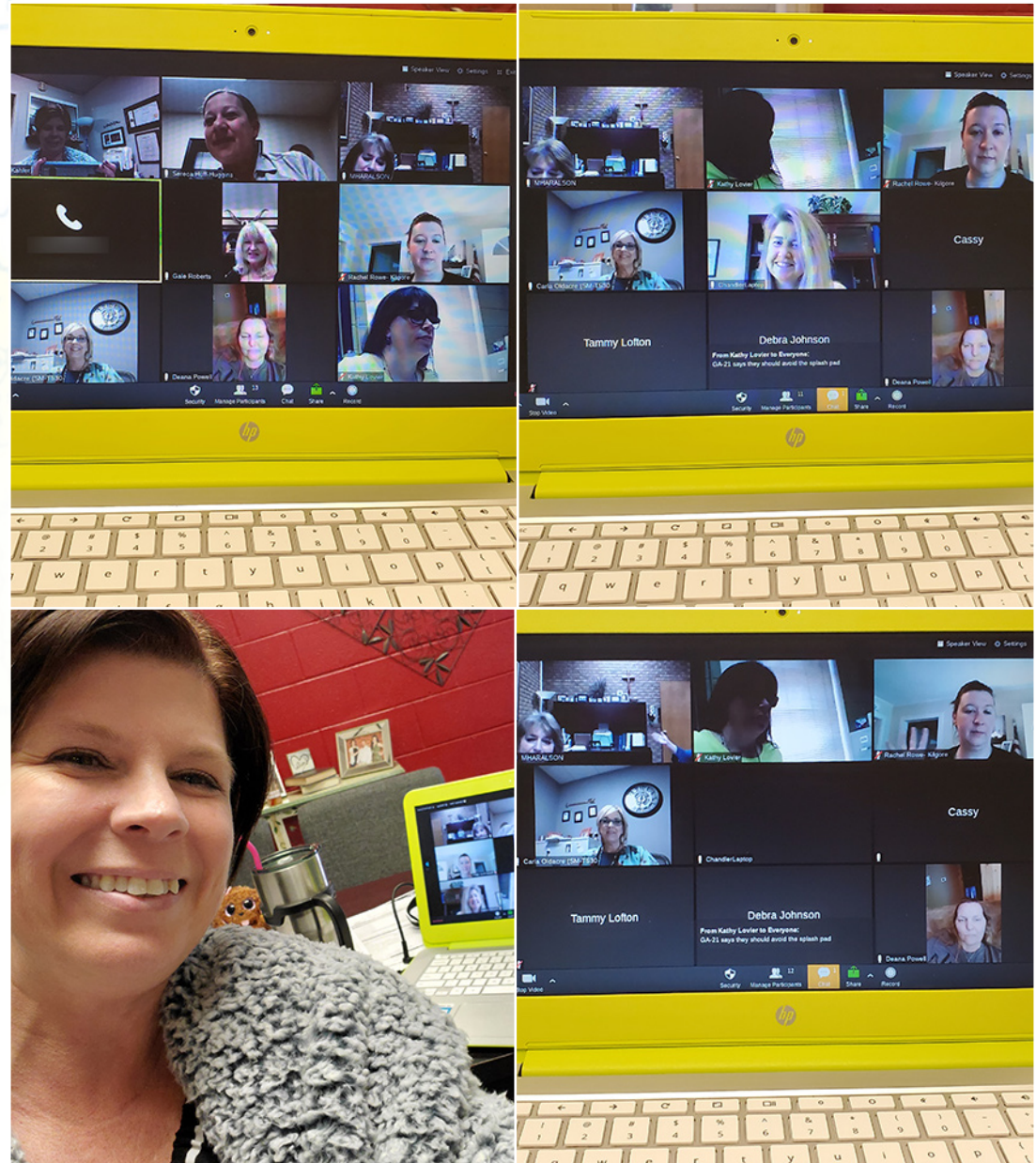
